Gifts to GPCF are carefully and responsibly managed to ensure your charitable intent is met.

BUILDING A LEGACY

Donors can create a legacy through charitable giving. GPCF supports various fund types and giving options. Our online portal allows donors to directly manage grants, view investment income, and monitor transactions.

FUND OPPORTUNITIES INCLUDE:

Field of Interest Fund: Donors specify a charitable purpose for annual distributions, such as education or health research.

Community Endowment: Donors designate a specific community to benefit from the gift.

Designated Funds: Donors specify the charitable fund beneficiaries.

Donor Advised Funds: Donors recommend eligible charitable recipient(s) for distribution of the funds annually.

Scholarship Funds: Donors can specify a degree program, institution of higher education or other criteria to award an annual scholarship.

GIVING OPPORTUNITIES INCLUDE:

Charitable Remainder Unitrust: Donors are provided income during their lifetime with the remainder of the charitable fund passing to GPCF upon the end of the trust term.

Gifts of Grain: Donors gift agricultural products prior to sale for a charitable purpose.

Appreciated Stock: Donors receive an immediate tax benefit when a gift of stock is given for a charitable purpose.

Planned Giving: Donors name GPCF as a beneficiary as part of their estate planning in support of a specified charitable cause.

GROWING COMMUNITY THROUGH LEADERSHIP



GPCF's community leadership is built on extraordinary partnerships like the Grinnell Education Partnership (GEP). Since 2015, GEP has supported Grinnell area families and young children with a variety of initiatives including summer enrichment programming, increasing access to food and other support resources, literacy enrichments, and collaborating with community partners to help provide Internet access to families. GPCF, in collaboration with Grinnell College, has raised funds for the program and helps to collect data about activities. To date, more than 30 community organizations have been involved in GEP activities, over 200 AmeriCorps members have been deployed across the community to support this work, and more than 100 initiatives have been launched to benefit

kids and families. Financial support is used for food, supplies, curriculum, training, and to support a cadre of AmeriCorps members

who serve with community partners. Broad, impactful, and sustained efforts like GEP are not possible without leadership from Greater Poweshiek Community Foundation and other local partners.





PROGRAMS & FUNDS

Greater Poweshiek Community Foundation

GPCF Administrative Fund: Your gift to this fund will support GPCF's mission-based operations in the county including growing charitable giving, educating and connecting donors to local needs they care about, servicing nonprofit programs and taking the lead on critical community issues.

Community Initiatives

Benda Fund: Your gift to the Benda Fund provides ongoing financial support for the Hartwick, Iowa community.

Brooklyn Community Foundation Endowment Fund*: Your support for this endowed fund will be used to provide grants to Brooklyn area charitable organizations and public entities. The Brooklyn Community Foundation's mission is to enhance the quality of life in the community.

Education

Central Iowa Christian School Fund: Your gift provides financial support for the Central Iowa Christian School established in Grinnell in 1983, serving children in grades kindergarten through 8th grade.

Citizen Scholarship Foundation of BGM Endowment Fund*: Your gift expands the educational opportunities of BGM High School graduates. By supporting this fund, you help make a strong, collective statement about the importance of education beyond high school.

Community Education Collaborative (CEC - formerly the Community Education Council): Your gift supports the CEC in its mission to coordinate community education in Grinnell through Bucket Courses and other educational efforts.
